Concentration skill, something which most of them lack due to their mental conditions, was also emphasised during the lessons.

Many of the members were interested to learn more after the 6 sessions. They find it very therapeutic when they were able to relax themselves and express their emotions through each stroke drawn. To many, it was an accomplishment as they admired their own masterpiece after each lesson.
