The students can choose from a variety of activities like board games, Wii games, karaoke, etc. Those who want to do their homework or



revision can also do so here. In addition, there will be special activities planned on a regular basis to promote healthy living and good character values. In August, we brought the youth to Sentosa for a game of volley ball and to build sandcastles. Team building spirit was emphasised through these 2 activities during the debrief session.

Our staff at the Centre is always ready to provide a listening ear to these young ones. We hope to mentor them during this delicate phase of their life as they journey towards their future of being a responsible adult.

### BCARE COFFEE Corner @ SAC







BCARE Coffee Corner ran its first program for seniors living in Compassvale Cape on 5 May 2018. Its aim is to help seniors grow in the community through participation of socio-recreational activities and life-long learning. About 50 seniors come every Saturday morning to participate in the various activities such as Line Dance, Karaoke, Basic Conversational English Class, Mind-Teasers and Table Games.

#### **SPECIAL ACTIVITIES THAT WERE ORGANISED IN 2018:**

- In June, our seniors visited National Gallery Singapore to appreciate the wide collection of Singapore and South East Asian art pieces as well as the beautifully restored City Hall and former Supreme Court.
- In August, our seniors were treated to lunch at Dignity Kitchen and also had hands-on experience in hydrotherapy. In the same month, we conducted a talk on Financial Planning.
- In September, our seniors went on an excursion to the Fire Flies Organic Farm to learn more about organic farming and healthy eating. Following that, they went to the Woodlands Wholesale Market and were delighted to fill up their shopping baskets with many merchandise purchased at cheaper prices.
- In October, 30 participants including 5 who are wheelchair bound were invited to a sumptuous lunch at Harmonies in Sync at Kranji Gallop Resort, courtesy of North-East CDC.
- In November, 47 participants attended a talk on Making of Will & Lasting Power of Attorney by a law professor. Again, in the same month, 42 participants went on a one-day Kulai Hakka Village Tour. This turned out to be a very relaxing and enjoyable overseas outing for all who went.

We have 4 young children who are all on formula milk. It is a major expense for us. My wife is unable to work, as she has to take care of the 4 kids at home. With a single income from driving a taxi, we were constantly short of money. When BCARE started assisting us with milk powder for the children in May this year, it was a godsend.



In addition, when I had my taxi contract terminated due to arrears in rental, BCARE also helped us with NTUC vouchers to tide us over the difficult period. The Social Worker, Ms Tay's timely follow-up always has an uplifting effect on our family. We are most grateful for the support given by BCARE.

Started officially in March this year, our Milk Powder Assistance *Programme* is catered to provide milk powder to children aged 1 to 12 years old from low-income families. It has supported 22 children thus far.
