ELDERCARE BEFRIENDERS

Lonely and isolated seniors often need a listening ear and caring touch. Our joyful Eldercare Befrienders visit them regularly to provide companionship. In a matter of time, a bond of friendship is cultivated, bringing sunshine into the lives of these seniors.



Why did you become a befriender?

As an Occupational Therapist, I have come across many lonely and isolated elderly people who have benefited from such a service. The compassion for the elderly people draws me to be friend them in such a manner.

Share an interesting/memorable encounter as a befriender.

I had the opportunity to accompany one of the elderly whom I was regularly visiting on a monthly basis, to the Hougang swimming pool for some "water walking" as a relief for her knee pains. It was heart-warming to see her really want to be more active and she was brave enough to try the exercise after being "housebound' for a couple of months.

What is your hope for the future of the elderly in Singapore?

I hope that they will be able to lead healthy and active lives and contribute to society in ways they wish to as long as they are able to. It would be great if society could recognize the abilities rather than disabilities of the elderly and give them the opportunity to contribute in some ways, no matter how small, so that they can feel enabled, treasured and useful.

Would you encourage others to become a befriender, if yes....why/how?

I would like to encourage more people to step out to become a befriender to the elderly people. The friendship an elderly can offer you is different from that you have with your peers. It is humbling to gain the trust and friendship of these people who have lived through a full life and have much wisdom to offer. Being a befriender also offers one the opportunity to be a blessing to others.

BCARE is one of the Preschool Outreach (PSO) Programme service providers appointed by the Early Childhood Development Agency (ECDA) in 2018. This programme aims to reduce the percentage of children from low-income families entering Primary One without any form of pre-school education. The PSO programme raises awareness of the value of pre-school education. It also assists families who need to enrol their children into pre-school and help the children keep regular attendance.

As we interact with these families, we realise that we are able to provide them with other services and support in order to meet their needs and help to improve their quality of life. Mdm Z who has 3 children of pre-school age is one such recipient. While helping her with the enrolment of her child into school, we discovered that the family required some financial assistance. Her family was placed on our Milk Powder Assistance Programme that enables her 3 children to receive a monthly supply of milk powder.
